SM-A: Photovoice Protocol

SETUP

- 1. Define photographers: The Mioritics volunteers
 - a. Our designated photographers participating in this method are the Mioritics Association volunteers who are already active in the organization (six individuals in the 14-25 age range).
- 2. Brief Volunteers on their task go over this protocol during a Zoom meeting so that they are familiar with the process
 - a. Go over instructions to avoid taking photographs with any identifying features of other people
- 3. Ensure proper photograph release forms and participation consent/assent forms are signed by the volunteers or their parents for volunteers under the age of 18.
- 4. Photographers will submit one picture per prompt provided.

PHOTOGRAPH PROMPTS

- 1. Take a picture of a place where you frequently spend free time with friends.
- 2. Take a picture of a place you go to spend time outdoors.
- 3. Take a picture of a location that makes you feel proud of Râşnov
- 4. Take a picture of a location where you feel you belong.

PROMT SCHEDULE

- 1. Photographers will receive the prompts once our methods are approved by IRB and the volunteers are briefed on this protocol.
- 2. They will be expected to submit their photographs before March 15th.

PHOTOGRAPH COLLECTION AND ORGANIZATION

- 1. Volunteers will be asked to submit photographs via WhatsApp by sending them directly to Allan Anderson. Photo files will each be named with the number of the prompt with which they are associated.
- 2. Photographs will be saved to a Google Drive folder managed by the WPI Research Team and cataloged by prompt and photographer.

DISCUSSION GUIDE:

- 1. Photographs will be presented on slides for both the WPI Research Team and participants to view
- 2. Volunteers will be encouraged to discuss the content of the photos and their meaning
- 3. Our team and the participants will discuss common themes that emerge in each of the prompted photo categories
- 4. Discussion Questions (for each photograph):
 - a. Why is this location important to you?
 - b. How often do you visit this location?
 - c. What do you do here?
 - d. Who do you go with?

- e. Share a fond memory of this location
- f. What feelings do you associate with this place?
- g. If a cultural/community event was hosted here, how would your feelings towards the place change if at all?
 - i. What events would you like to have here?
 - ii. Are there any that you do not want to have here?
- 5. Wrap-up Questions:
 - a. Were there any places around Râșnov that you were surprised were not pictured?
 - b. Were any of the prompts especially difficult to find a location that fit the category?
- 6. Photos of locations and activities most frequently discussed will be used in the display mapping protocol

PICTURE CONTENT ANALYSIS

1. The research team will code the discussion to find common activity and location themes that will develop an understanding of where and how Râşnov youth spend their free time

SM-F: Intercept Survey Protocol

Before the survey:

- 1. Before March 30th, get permission to use the space (supermarket parking lot) from the supermarket director with the help of our collaborator
- 2. Prepare a note sheet with space to record multiple-choice answers and long-response answers
- 3. Prepare resources such as clipboards, pens, and consent forms.

The survey (March 30th & 31st):

- 1. WPI researchers and Mioritics volunteers meet outside the market at 12:00 EET
- 2. Split into groups of 3, consisting of 1 or 2 of the WPI researchers and 1 or 2 Mioritics Volunteers
- 3. One of the Mioritics volunteers will approach a potential interviewee–and their parents if they are under 18–introducing the WPI researchers and the purpose of the survey
- 4. Attain written or verbal consent from those ages 18-20, and written consent from the parents of those ages 14-17 before starting the survey, providing a Romanian translation if needed
- 5. Conduct the survey with the interviewer recording short answer responses and another group member serving as the dedicated note-taker focusing on the longer responses

SM-K: Interactive Mapping Activity Instructions

Before the activity

- Ask yourself these questions
 - a. What are my favorite places in Râșnov?
 - b. What do I like to do at these places?

Beginning of activity

- Look at the places pictured around the map. Are any of the places you thought about shown in the pictures?
 - c. If the place you thought about is in one of the pictures, proceed to section mapping with picture
 - d. If the place you thought about is not in any of the pictures, proceed to section mapping without picture

Mapping with picture

- 1. Look at the icon next to the picture
- 2. Find the matching icon on the map
- 3. Recall the activity you like to do in this location
 - a. Look at the table at the bottom of the instructions to select the proper pin color
- 4. Place the pin on the map next to the icon
- 5. Proceed to end of activity

Mapping without picture

- 1. Select one of the tags with string
- 2. Write the name of the location on the tag using the markers provided
- 3. Recall the activity you like to do at your chosen location
 - a. Look at the table at the bottom of the instructions to select the proper pin color.
- 4. Place the string against the map where your place is located and stick the pin inside the loop
- 5. Proceed to end of activity

SM-L: Pick-a-Side Activity Instructions

Participant instructions:

- 1. Find a group of 4-6 participants
- 2. Line up with space to move left or right
- 3. After each prompt decide which answer you resonate most strongly with and all together move to the corresponding side for each question

Prompts:

- 1. Do you prefer a fun event that is Indoors or Outdoors?
- 2. Would you prefer an event during the afternoon or evening?
- 3. Would you prefer an event on a weekday or weekend?
- 4. Would you rather watch a movie or make a craft?
- 5. Do you prefer to spend time with a group of 5 or fewer friends, or 5+ friends?
- 6. Would you rather go hiking or play a sport?
- 7. Would you prefer an event that is free and open to the public or paid and private?
- 8. Would you rather attend a workshop to learn a new skill or practice one you already know?

SM-M: "Build-Your-Own-Event" Activity Instructions

During the activity

- 1. Look through the "meat" cards to select the activity for your perfect event. If the activity is not listed on one of the premade cards, write it on the blank "meat" card using a dry-erase marker.
- 2. Repeat this process with each category to create the event.
- 3. If there is anything else that does not fit in a pre-assigned category, use the blank "condiment" cards to write it in.
- 4. Organize the cards vertically on the table to resemble a complete burger.

Ending the activity

- Ask participants:
 - Have you been to a similar event?
 - Do you know of any events that are similar?
 - Would you be interested in helping to actually create this event?
- Team and volunteers:
 - Record the created events ("burgers") by photographing the vertically-oriented cards. These images will be analyzed later as data for the youth profile.






