


#### Introduction

Background






#### Timeline of the Ala Wai Canal and Genki Ala Wai

1921-1928

The Ala Wai Canal is built to drain rice paddies for land reclamation and flood mitigation.

#### 1928 Onwards

The watershed disruption leads to **pollution**. This pollution accumulates into sludge, which decomposes and releases **dangerous gasses**.



Sludge: Accumulated organic material.



#### 2006

48 million gallons of untreated sewage is diverted into the Ala Wai. The idea of using EM solution to clean the canal first comes up.

#### 2019

The Genki Ala Wai Project begins under the Hawai'i Exemplary State Foundation, using EM bioremediation to **restore** the Ala Wai Canal.

**EM: Effective Microorganisms** 

#### 2026

Have the Ala Wai Canal be both **fishable** and **swimmable** and serve as a worldwide example of watershed restoration.

Genki Balls: Tennis ball-sized and made of clay soil, rice bran, molasses, water, and EM1 solution


