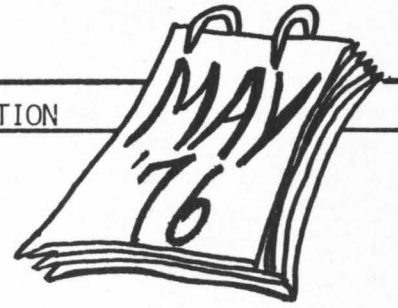


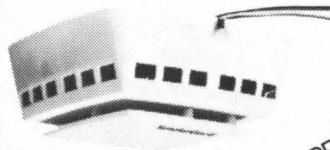

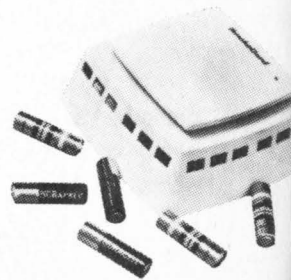

FROM MARY TUCK...

National Poison Prevention Week has come and gone, but the problem of poisoning exists on a 24-hour basis.

The U.S. Poison Control Center estimates that approximately 500,000 children are poisoned annually. 500 are killed; others suffer from permanent injuries.

The greatest and most common cause of poisoning in children is the ingestion of household products. ALWAYS KEEP HAZARDOUS PRODUCTS OUT OF SIGHT, AND OUT OF THE REACH OF YOUNG CHILDREN.

Store medicines, in their original containers, separately from other household products. Be certain labels are kept on all products and medicines. ALWAYS read the label before taking ANY medication! When children are old enough to read, AND understand, teach them never to take medication without following the label instructions. Until they reach that age, KEEP ALL MEDICATIONS AWAY FROM THEM, (preferably in a locked cabinet)!

REMEMBER...when taking medication, turn on the light; never reach for a bottle in an unlighted room and expect to know what its contents are. BEWARE...BE CAREFUL...BE SURE...BE SAFE...BE ALIVE!!!

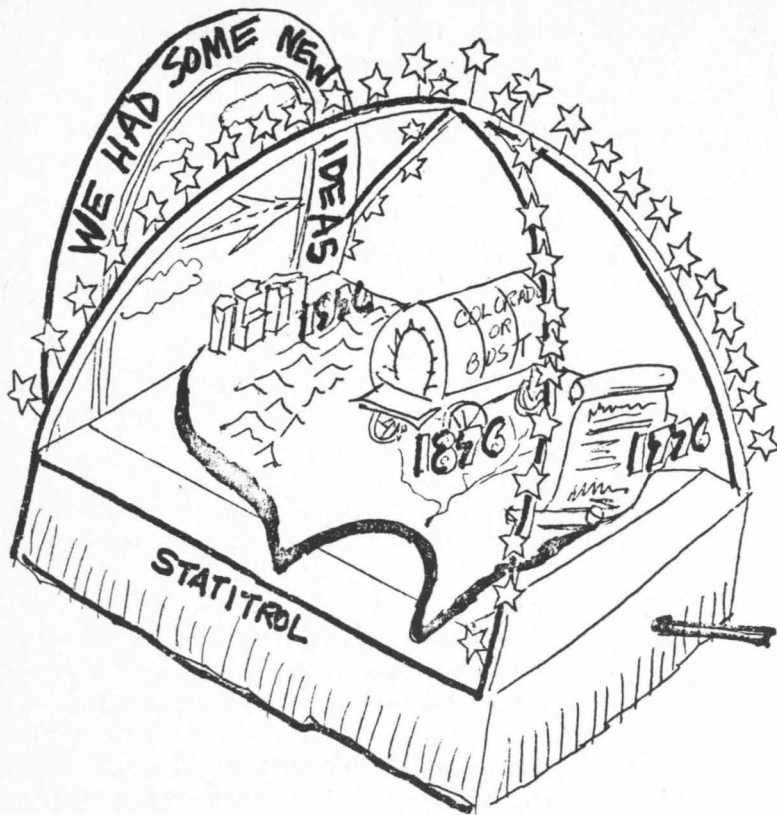
