


We have noticed many employees who are not wearing their glasses leaving themselves unprotected against possible injuries.

FIVE LIVES SAVED BY "SMOKEGARD" IN WICKLIFFE, OHIO

"I purchased two of your Model 700 "SmokeGard" ionization detectors. I installed one at the top of the basement stairway and the other just outside our first floor bedroom. I also worked out a plan for escape with the two oldest children, but with a 4 and 5 year old, my main concern was the ability to get them out quickly in an emergency.

On April 28, 1975, at 1:30 in the morning, that need arose. A fire quickly set off the alarm in the detector at the top of the basement stairway. My wife was awakened by the alarm and in turn woke me. Our first reaction was simply 'false alarm' as there was no evidence of fire or smoke on the first floor. After going through the kitchen to the basement stairway we found smoke coming from the basement along the ceiling line and curling around the alarming smoke detector. Amazingly, we still did not realize there was a major fire; I simply told my wife to get the two children upstairs and get them out of the house. I, in turn, called the fire department and reported only 'smoke in the house'. I was able to partially dress and, after getting our two-year old, all five of us, plus the dog, went out the front door to the safety of the family car. In a few seconds I tried to re-enter the house but found it virtually impossible due to the heavy smoke; it was only then I could actually see flame and realized we had a major fire.

After the fire was extinguished, one of the fireman handed me the smoke detector that was

mounted outside our bedroom. The plastic case had been completely deformed from the intense heat but the alarm horn was still sounding loudly. I had to remove one of the batteries in order to silence the alarm.

What we thought was only a minor problem when the detector first alarmed, had literally destroyed the work shop and kitchen above. Smoke had penetrated and stained every corner of the house; paint was blistered and windows cracked. When our two cats were found dead from smoke inhalation, it occurred to us that could have been us. The total damage to the house and contents is over thirty thousand dollars.

Thankfully we survived and have begun repairs, and I credit that to only two things: the grace of God and the smoke detectors that worked...and worked quickly.

As I understand, it is your policy to replace free of charge any detectors which have proven effective thru use. You will find however that I have already purchased two new detectors, as I am convinced now more than ever my home will never be without them. If you would like to send replacements, I have relatives whom I love a great deal. I would pass these detectors on to them with the hope they never have the experience we have had, but with the confidence that if they do, SmokeGard detectors may also save the life of someone very dear to us. Thank you again."


