Executive Summary

I think that one of the biggest ironies of my life up to this point is that I was too frightened to set foot on a stage until my senior year of high school. Looking at where I am today and everything I've done both on stage and off, I feel like I was born to be in the theatre. When I think back to that first opening night and remember how scared and nervous I was to go onstage, I realize just how far I've really come.

When I first arrived at WPI, I had no idea that after what felt like the four shortest years of my life I would have become a part of the most beautiful community of people I have ever known. Now, as a senior, I am a member of Alpha Psi Omega, I have served on the officer board of Masque, and I have worked on more shows than I can count. I now consider myself to be a well-rounded thespian, with knowledge both of on- and off-stage procedures. I cannot believe how much I've grown, both as a professional and as a person.

When it came time to decide what to do for my MQP, I was at a complete loss. I knew that in order to complete such a large and important project I would have to do more than I had ever done before in any of my previous roles. I wanted to push myself out of my comfort zone, but I didn't know how, until I sat down with Susan to discuss my prospects. Before I realized what I was saying, I asked her if she had chosen a director for the next year's B-Term show. I had never directed before, and I didn't have a clue where to begin, but clearly something was telling me it was time.

I still remember what she said to me after considering and accepting me for the position. She sat me down and told me, "I think it's time we did *Earnest*." I couldn't believe it. I was going to get a chance to direct Oscar Wilde's most famous work? It gave me goosebumps. From the moment we decided on the play, my head was filled with wild dreams of Oscar Wilde's

England: the colors and clothing, the mannerisms and oddities – I couldn't wait to get started. At the same time, I was completely terrified. In time, however, I was able to move past my anxiety. Each day of the production was a learning experience for me, and while I stumbled sometimes, as is inevitable when you are learning something new, I succeeded in the end.

The experience of directing *The Importance of Being Earnest* as a first-time director was one that I wouldn't trade for anything else in the world. It was inspiring and amazingly fun, and, best of all, it was a challenge. To be the figurehead of a production like *Earnest*, to ensure its success with every bit of energy I had, made B-Term 2015 the best term of my WPI undergraduate career. I could not be more proud of how the production turned out.

An Explanation of this Project

I would like to quickly explore the nature of this particular MQP. I am an artist above all else: my passion lies in design and visual brilliance. While I enjoy writing, the idea of writing one more paper was not one I particularly relished. So, I've done away with the essay portion of this MQP. Instead, I have compiled an illustrated timeline of my journey through my undergraduate career in WPI theatre, starting with my first term as a freshman and culminaing with the accomplishment that was the essence of this MQP: directing *The Importance of Being Earnest*.
