

### Youth Leadership is an effective technique to reduce violence








Relationship violence lessons are most effective when reinforced over multiple sessions.

### 50 hours per year over 4-5 years









Young people are able to relate to scenarios and storytelling and have beneficial discussions surrounding the characters and stories.

Young people respond better to lessons that are tailored to their age group.




### Tailoring Lessons to the Audience is an effective technique to engage youth


