



Sexual Education in Honduras

Honduras faces high rates of unplanned pregnancies and STDs (1) (2).


Objectives


- 1. Educate Hondurans on important topics in sex ed

Create an 8 year long advertising campaign starting in 2016 that targets adolescents.









Predicted Results
